Macquarie Street, Hyde Park and Darling Harbour

From the Opera House, walk around the foreshores of Farm Cove to the Royal Botanic Gardens, a place of natural beauty, peace and relaxation Tel: 9231 8111 and across the Domain to Macquarie Street and on to Hyde Park

Macquarie Street. Some of Sydney's most beautiful and important buildings including The Conservatorium of Music, Government House, State Library of NSW (incorporating the Mitchell Library), State Parliament, Sydney Hospital, the old Mint Building, Hyde Park Barracks and the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages.

Hyde Park. The 'lungs of Sydney'. A particularly good spot for a lunchtime picnic or just relax under a shady tree. Features, Archibald Fountain, statue of Captain Cook, ANZAC War Memorial and Pool of Remembrance. Nearby is St Mary's Cathedral which overlooks Hyde Park and Cook + Phillip Park Indoor Aquatic Centre. The Great Synagogue is on the Elizabeth Street side of Hyde Park.

Darling Harbour. Take the Metro Monorail or Light Rail from Sydney CBD or Central Railway or walk to Darling Harbour, one of the world's great waterfront destinations, and many of Australia's key tourist attractions including Australian National Maritime Museum, Powerhouse Museum, Sydney Aquarium, Sydney Convention and Exhibition Centre, Sydney Wildlife World as well as cafés, pubs, nightspots, restaurants and shops. Nearby are Sydney's famous traditional Chinatown, Market City, Paddy's Markets, Fish Markets and Star City Casino.
